MusiXploitation is a series of posters for the film that are only in the hearts of rabid fans. In the late 90s, Master P would release a full-length narrative film of the same name as his albums, which was a kind of fictional precursor to Lemonade with some very fearful dialogue. The new series is fleeting in a world where the practice was caught with the rest of the music industry. Created by Paris-based art director David Redon, the series features blaxploitation-style posters for songs and albums by Amy Winehouse, 2Pac and Jay-Z. (Previously, Redon had pounded musicians with vintage ads.) Some are thematically appropriate, such as the Frank Ocean galaxy, spooky Pyramids, and others will no doubt make their namesakes very angry, as The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill turns into a bikini bank theft caper. Like the recent Cover of Quentin Tarantino's book featured on Co.Create, some entries are marred by almost comically bad photoshop.
